TamilNadu Highlights

Tamil Nadu Introduces Bills for PwD Representation in Local Bodies

- Honorable Chief Minister M.K. Stalin introduced two Bills in the Legislative Assembly to ensure representation for persons with disabilities (PwDs) in all local bodies across Tamil Nadu.
- Urban and Rural Representation:
 - The **first Bill** seeks to amend the **Tamil Nadu Urban Local Bodies Act, 1998** to nominate PwDs to urban local bodies (town panchayats, municipal councils, and municipal corporations).
 - The **second Bill** amends the **Tamil Nadu Panchayats Act, 1994** to nominate PwDs to rural local bodies (village panchayats, panchayat union councils, and district panchayats).
- Increased Representation:
 - Currently, only 35 PwDs are elected to urban local bodies.
 - If passed, around 650 PwDs will be nominated to urban local bodies, and 12,913
 PwDs will be represented in rural bodies.
- Government Commitment:
 - Honorable Chief Minister Stalin emphasized the government's social justice objective of providing "everything for everyone" and highlighted the doubling of the allocation for PwDs' welfare, from ₹667 crore to ₹1,432 crore.
- Employment Opportunities:
 - The government's initiatives include **4% reservation** for PwDs, resulting in **1,493** government jobs being allocated to PwDs in the last four years.
- **Social Justice Focus**: This initiative strengthens Tamil Nadu's ongoing efforts to ensure equal rights and opportunities for PwDs, promoting inclusivity in local governance.

Tamil Nadu Government Reiterates Use of Tamil as Official Language

- Tamil Nadu government issued an advisory reinforcing the mandate to use **Tamil** as the official language in all government offices and communications.
- Mandatory Tamil Usage:
 - Government Orders: The advisory reiterates that government orders should be issued only in Tamil.
 - **Circulars**: All circulars from government departments should be in Tamil as well.

- **Official Correspondence**: Communications and letters, except in exempted cases, should be conducted in Tamil.
- **Public Communications**: The advisory specifies that letters received in Tamil from the public should be **replied to in Tamil**, and all related notes should also be in Tamil.
- **Signature Requirement**: Government employees are instructed to **sign only in Tamil** on all official documents and correspondence.
- **Translation Process**: For documents and government orders exempted from the Tamil-only rule and issued in English, departments are required to send them to the **Translation Division** of the Tamil Development and Information Department for translation into Tamil.
- Language Compliance: The move aims to ensure consistent use of Tamil in all government dealings, in line with the Official Languages Act, reinforcing the importance of Tamil in official state affairs.

Madras High Court Orders Removal of Caste References in School and College Names

- The Madras High Court ordered all schools and colleges in Tamil Nadu to remove caste appellations from their names by 2025-26.
- Notices will be issued to institutions with caste-based names, giving them four weeks to comply.
- Non-compliant institutions will face withdrawal of recognition and student transfers starting 2026-27.
- The court also directed the government to remove caste-based terms from government school names.
- Caste-based societies must amend bylaws to allow membership for all, regardless of caste.
- The court rejected caste-based legal claims and criticized the pervasive nature of the caste system across religions.

Best Transgender Award on Transgender Day 2025

 Honorable Chief Minister Stalin awarded the winners with a cheque of ₹50,000 and a certificate of appreciation for their outstanding social contributions.



Award Overview:

Since 2021, the Tamil Nadu government has been presenting the
 "Best Transgender Award" annually. This award acknowledges transgender individuals who
 play a key role in society and serve as role models with their efforts.

Government Initiatives:

• The Tamil Nadu government has implemented several welfare programs for the upliftment of transgender individuals, including the Puthumai Penn Scheme and educational assistance for transgenders.

Award Criteria:

• The award is given to transgender individuals who have excelled in **education**, **arts**, and **social service** and have contributed as **role models** for others.

Former Supreme Court Judge Dinesh Maheshwari Appointed Chairperson of 23rd Law Commission of India

Justice **Dinesh Maheshwari**, retired Supreme Court judge, has been appointed as the **Chairperson** of the 23rd Law Commission of India (LCI).

About the 23rd Law Commission of India:

- Constitution Date: September 1, 2024
- Term Duration: Three years
- Predecessor: 22nd Law Commission (ended August 31, 2024)
 Previous Chairperson: Justice (Retd.) Ritu Raj Awasthi (now appointed to the Lokpal)

Composition of the 23rd LCI:

- Chairperson: Justice Dinesh Maheshwari (Full-time)
- Full-time Members:
 - Advocate Hitesh Jain
 - Professor **D.P. Verma** (also served in the previous Commission)
- Additional Full-time Members (including Member-Secretary)
- **Ex-officio Members:** From the **Departments of Legal Affairs** and **Legislative Part-time Members:** Up to five, at government discretion
- Notable Experts Associated

Key Objectives & Mandates:

The 23rd Law Commission is tasked with:

- Identifying obsolete laws and recommending their repeal or amendment
- Examining the feasibility of implementing a Uniform Civil Code (UCC) nationwide

Justice B.R. Gavai Named 52nd Chief Justice of India (CJI)

- Justice B.R. Gavai appointed as successor to CJI **Sanjiv Khanna**, retiring on **May 13, 2025**.
- Will become the **52nd Chief Justice of India** at age 64.
- Serving in the **Supreme Court since 2019**, known for key rulings in **constitutional and administrative law**.
- Major judgments include: **Demonetisation (2023), Article 370 (2019),** SC/ST sub-categorization (2024), Bulldozer demolitions (2024).
- Expected to focus on **upholding constitutional values** and **rule of law**.
- Seen as a strong voice for **judicial independence and inclusion**.

- **Defence Minister Rajnath Singh** declared **2025 as the Year of Reforms** for transforming the armed forces.


Topic: Important Days

- **Significance:** First time that **Himachal Day** celebrations were held in the **Pangi Valley**, creating great enthusiasm among the local residents.
- **Cultural Programs:** Vibrant programs showcased the rich cultural heritage of Himachal Pradesh.







General Information About Himachal Pradesh:

- Region: North India, situated in the western Himalayas.
- Boundaries: Shares borders with Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh, Punjab, Haryana, Uttarakhand, and Uttar Pradesh.
- Capitals:
 - **Shimla** (summer capital)
 - Dharamshala (winter capital)
- National Parks:
 - Great Himalayan National Park

 - Khirganga National Park
