TamilNadu Highlights

'Naan Mudhalvan' Scheme Plays Key Role in UPSC Success

Tamil Nadu Deputy Chief Minister **Udhayanidhi Stalin** praised the **'Naan Mudhalvan' scheme** for its role in increasing the number of civil services exam qualifiers from the state.



Speaking in the **State Assembly**, he noted that the **number of UPSC qualifiers** had significantly dropped to **27 in 2021**, but the situation improved after implementing targeted support through the **'Naan Mudhalvan' scheme**.

- The scheme, introduced under the **Special Programme Implementation Department**, provides **financial aid** for **UPSC prelims and mains coaching**.
- In **2024**, **47** students from Tamil Nadu cleared the UPSC exam a **30%** increase from the previous year.
- In 2025, 57 students cleared the exam, 50 of whom received support under the scheme.

About Nan Mudhalvan Scheme:

- 'Naan Mudhalvan' scheme, aimed at empowering youth across the state.
- The initiative targets **10 lakh youth annually**, equipping them with skills to help them harness their talents for national development.
- The scheme focuses on identifying, training, and providing career and academic guidance to talented students in government-run and State-aided educational institutions.

Tamil Nadu to Introduce Al-Powered Driver Monitoring System on Buses

- The Tamil Nadu government will **pilot an Al-powered driver monitoring system** in **500 buses** to enhance **road safety** and improve **driver performance**.
- The system will track **driver facial expressions**, **eye gaze**, **and head movements**, alerting them if signs of fatigue or distraction are detected.
- Additionally, 360-degree cameras will be installed in 4,000 buses to eliminate blind spots and enhance pedestrian and cyclist visibility.
- Under the 'Accident Free Tamil Nadu' initiative, 100 critical accident-prone roads will be prioritized for intervention.

India Suspends Indus Water Treaty (IWT)

Trigger: Pahalgam terror attack in J&K (April 23) — 26 killed, including tourists

Government's Stand: Treaty held "in abeyance" until Pakistan credibly and irrevocably abjures

support for cross-border terrorism

About the Indus Water Treaty (IWT)

• Signed in: 1960

Mediated by: World Bank

• **Between:** India (upper riparian) & Pakistan (lower riparian)

• River System Involved:

- Eastern rivers: Ravi, Beas, Sutlej (allocated to India for full use ~33 MAF/year)
- Western rivers: Indus, Jhelum, Chenab (allocated mainly to Pakistan ~135 MAF/year)
- India's rights: Limited use of western rivers for domestic, non-consumptive, irrigation, and hydroelectric generation (up to 3.6 MAF storage allowed)

Implications of Suspension

- Reservoir flushing (desilting) and filling can now be done anytime, not just in monsoon (August).
- India can **ignore objections** from Pakistan on design and operation of hydropower projects (e.g., Kishanganga, Ratle).
- **Design restrictions** on new hydroelectric and irrigation projects no longer apply.

Impact on Pakistan

- **Flood data sharing** can be stopped crucial during monsoon season.
- **Filling reservoirs** in critical sowing periods can **hamper agriculture** in Pakistan's Punjab.
- **Tours and inspections** by Pakistani officials under the treaty can be stopped.

Legal Angle

- No explicit abrogation clause in IWT.
- However, Article 62 of the Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties allows withdrawal in case of "fundamental change in circumstances".

Cruise Tourism Boost: Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal Flags Off Cruise Operations

Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal flagged off cruise operations from the **Mumbai International Cruise Terminal (MICT)**.

• MICT, developed under the **Cruise Bharat Mission**, is built to global standards and will significantly enhance cruise tourism in India.

Terminal Highlights

- MICT can handle 1 million passengers annually, with a daily capacity of approx. 10,000 passengers.
- It complements existing international cruise terminals at Visakhapatnam and Chennai.

Inauguration of Key Projects

- Sonowal also inaugurated the renovated Fire Memorial at Victoria Docks.
- Two heritage buildings Fort House Ballard Estate and Evelyn House in Colaba were also reopened.
- The Sagar Upvan Garden and Shore to Ship Electric Supply under the Green Port Initiative were launched.

About Cruise Bharat Mission

- Launched on September 30, 2024, at Mumbai Port.
- Aims to position India as a top global cruise destination.
- Based on **three pillars**: Ocean & Harbour Cruises, River & Inland Cruises, Island & Lighthouse Cruises.
- Key goals include:
 - 10 international sea cruise terminals
 - 100 river cruise terminals
 - 5 marinas along the coast
 - Integration of over 5000 km of waterways.

Union Minister Amit Shah Inaugurates 'Save Earth Conclave'

- On Earth Day (April 22), Amit Shah inaugurated the 'Save Earth Conclave' at NASC Complex, New Delhi.
- The conclave focused on leveraging bamboo to tackle climate change and promote sustainable economic growth.
- The India Sustainability Awards 2025 were presented to 15 pioneers for outstanding contributions in climate action and green innovation.



• Earth Day was first celebrated in 1970, following its proposal at the 1969 UNESCO summit.

Poshan Tracker App Wins PM's Award for Excellence in Public Administration

Award Recognition

 The Secretary, Ministry of Women and Child Development received the Prime Minister's Award for Excellence in Public Administration in the Innovation category for the Poshan Tracker app.

About the Poshan Tracker

- It is a **mobile-based application** used by **Anganwadi workers** to collect and provide **real-time data** on nutrition and childcare services.
- Developed under the initiatives Saksham Anganwadi and Mission Poshan 2.0.

Purpose and Impact

• Aims to improve the **efficiency and transparency** in the delivery of services under the Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS).

Topic: Science and Technology

India Launches First-Ever Seed Germination Database for Ecological Restoration

- Ecological Restoration Alliance-India (ERA-I) has launched a seed germination database offering over 1,000 techniques for 465 native plant species.
- The database is designed to support restoration practitioners, nursery managers, and native plant enthusiasts in growing native plants for ecological restoration.
- It features species like Aegle marmelos (wood apple), Bauhinia racemosa (beedi leaf tree), and Ficus benghalensis (banyan), which are essential for creating climate-resilient ecosystems.
- The initiative aims to make **germination protocols** more accessible, helping people to succeed in **growing native plants** for restoration projects.

- ERA-I's database supports India's pledge under the Bonn Challenge, aiming to restore 26 million hectares of degraded land by 2030.
- **Native plants** are key to ecological restoration as they are **adapted** to local soil and climatic conditions, requiring minimal human intervention once established.
- The **collaborative effort** involves 23 contributors from 11 institutions, sharing valuable **germination knowledge** to support **restoration projects** across India.

International Buddhist Conclave Inaugurated in Arunachal Pradesh

- Inauguration: Arunachal Pradesh Deputy CM Chowna Mein inaugurated the International Conclave in Namsai.
 - Theme: 'Buddha Dhamma and North-East India's Cultural Heritage'.
- Organizers: Hosted by the International Buddhist Confederation and the Ministry of Culture,
 Government of India.
 - Focus: Explores Buddhism's spiritual and cultural impact in the North-East region.
- International Participation: Bhutan's Consul General Jigme Thinley Namgyal attended the inaugural session.
 - Duration: The conclave is a two-day event.

Surya Kiran Airshow in Patna Honours 1857 Hero Babu Kunwar Singh

- The Indian Air Force's Surya Kiran aerobatic team performed a stunning airshow over Patna.
- The event paid **tribute to Babu Kunwar Singh**, a prominent leader of the **1857 revolt** from Bihar's **Bhojpur** region.
 - A skydiver parachuted from an IAF helicopter, unfurling the Indian national flag mid-air.
 - The two-day airshow began with aerial displays celebrating courage and legacy.
- The Surya Kiran squadron demonstrated precision flying and synchronized formations. .The show is part of Valour Day Vijayotsav commemorations.
 - The event highlights **Babu Kunwar Singh's contributions** to India's first war of independence.

National Panchayati Raj Day 2025: Celebrating Grassroots Democracy on 24 April

 National Panchayati Raj Day is observed every year on 24 April to commemorate the day in 1993 when the 73rd Constitutional Amendment came into effect, granting constitutional status to Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs).

- The day was first celebrated in 2010 and reflects Mahatma Gandhi's vision of village-level self-governance or "Panchayati rule".
- In **2025**, **no specific theme** has been announced for the observance.
- For the **first time**, the national-level celebration is being held at **Lohna Uttar Gram**Panchayat, Jhanjharpur Block, Madhubani district, Bihar.
- The event will also witness the presentation of the **National Panchayat Awards 2025**, which recognize and encourage **top-performing PRIs**.
- These awards are based on states' nominations and are finalized by the **Ministry of**Panchayati Raj.
- Since 2022, the awards have been aligned with the 17 Sustainable Development Goals
 (SDGs), localized into nine broad themes such as poverty alleviation, health, education, and
 gender equality.

International Highlights

Project SeaCURE: Enhancing Ocean-Based Carbon Capture in the UK

- Ocean as a Carbon Sink: The ocean absorbs nearly 25% of CO₂ emissions from human activities, especially from fossil fuels.
- Launch of Project SeaCURE: Initiated in Weymouth, England, the project seeks to boost the ocean's ability to absorb CO₂ by removing it directly from seawater.
- Innovative Technique: SeaCURE acidifies seawater pumped from the English Channel to convert dissolved CO₂ into gas for capture.
- Sustainable Materials: The extracted CO₂ is concentrated using eco-friendly materials, such as charred coconut husks, and is then securely stored.
- Closed-Loop System: After CO₂ removal, the neutralized seawater is returned to the ocean, allowing it to continue absorbing CO₂.
- Pilot Scale Impact: Currently, SeaCURE captures about 100 metric tonnes of CO₂ annually.
- Challenges Ahead:
 - High energy demand for extraction requires renewable energy to maintain sustainability.
 - Ecological concerns exist about the impact on marine life, like mussels and phytoplankton, from altered seawater.
- Broader Initiative: SeaCURE is part of the UK's £3 million carbon capture program, which funds 15 pilot projects to explore cost-effective, scalable climate solutions.
- Environmental Context: The project also draws attention to ocean acidification, a growing threat to marine biodiversity and ecosystem health.

India-Norway Marine Pollution Initiative Aids Plastic Reduction in Yamuna

- The India-Norway Marine Pollution Initiative (INMPI) is a bilateral initiative launched in **2019** under the India-Norway Ocean Dialogue.
- It aims to tackle marine litter and microplastics (MPs), particularly from land-based sources.
- INMPI has undertaken multiple projects to reduce marine plastic pollution.
