Tamilnadu Highlights:

Rs. 576.73 Crore Schemes Announced for the Welfare of Gulf of Mannar Fishermen

- To improve the livelihoods of fishermen in the Gulf of Mannar region, the Tamil Nadu government has launched new schemes worth **Rs. 216.73 crore**, including:
 - Seaweed cultivation, processing, value-added products, and marketing-related skill training and tools.
 - Cage-based fish and mud crab farming, processing, and sale Rs. 25.82 crore.
 - Fish drying technology, training, and equipment Rs. 9.90 crore for 2,500 fisher families.
 - Alternative marine-related livelihoods such as net making and repair, boat building and repair, dried fish production, ornamental fish tank making, boat operator training, and seashell handicrafts – Rs. 54.48 crore.
 - Non-marine livelihoods like mushroom farming, tourist boat operations, handicrafts, homemade spice powder production, beauty training, and millet-based food production – Rs. 53.62 crore.

Beneficiary Districts

 These initiatives will benefit fishermen in Ramanathapuram, Nagapattinam, Thoothukudi, Pudukkottai, Tiruvarur, and Thanjavur—coastal districts highly affected by repeated arrests by the Sri Lankan Navy.

Fishing Harbours – Rs. 360 Crore

- To support deep-sea fishing in the southern region and Indian Ocean:
- Three major fishing harbours will be constructed:

National Highlights:

India Overtakes Germany in Wind & Solar Power Generation (2024)

- India became the world's 3rd-largest generator of wind and solar electricity, surpassing Germany.
- Wind and solar contributed **10%** of India's total electricity in 2024.
- Solar alone contributed 7%, doubling its share since 2021.

India's 2024 Renewable Energy Milestones:

- Added **24 GW** of solar capacity in 2024 (2x more than 2023).
- Ranked **3rd globally** in solar capacity addition (after **China** and **USA**).
- Recorded **20 TWh increase** in solar generation (4th highest globally).
- Total **clean sources** accounted for **22%** of electricity generation.

Hydropower: 8%Wind + Solar: 10%

Other renewables/nuclear: ~4%

Global Context:

- Wind + Solar: **15%** of global electricity (2024).
- Solar: Fastest-growing power source 20th year in a row.
 - Added **474 TWh** in 2024.
 - Share in global electricity mix: **6.9%** (doubled in 3 years).
- Total **low-carbon electricity** (renewables + nuclear): **40.9%** highest since 1940s.

India's Clean Energy Trajectory

- Targets:
 - o 50% of installed capacity from non-fossil sources by 2030 (NDC).
 - 500 GW non-fossil capacity by 2030 (unofficial but guiding).
- Challenge: Meeting rising power demand while increasing clean energy share.
 - Heatwaves in 2024 drove 1/3rd of the demand spike.

Telangana Govt Drops Charges Against University of Hyderabad Students

- Telangana government has decided to drop charges against University of Hyderabad students involved in land protest.
- Students had protested against tree cutting on 400 acres of land at Kancha Gachibowli near the university.
- A three-member ministerial committee was formed to resolve the Kancha Gachibowli land dispute.
- The panel includes **Deputy CM Vikramarka**, **D. Sridhar Babu**, and **Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy**.
- University Teachers' Association and civil society groups submitted demands to the panel.
- The panel clarified that police presence is required as per Supreme Court orders to protect the disputed land.

Background on the Kancha Gachibowli Issue:

- Students are opposing the **auction of 400 acres** claimed to be part of the university's original **2,324-acre** land.
- The Telangana government claims ownership over the land, leading to legal disputes.

Telangana Governor Inaugurates Renovated Tribal Museum at Bhadrachalam

- Governor Jishnu Dev Varma formally inaugurated the renovated Tribal Museum at ITDA headquarters, Bhadrachalam.
- Bhadrachalam is located in **Bhadradri Kothagudem district**, **Telangana**.

- The museum has been renovated by the Integrated Tribal Development Agency (ITDA).
- It aims to showcase tribal culture, heritage, and lifestyle.
- The Governor toured the museum and interacted with tribal individuals.
- Tribal artisans displayed their handicrafts in a setup replicating a tribal village environment.
- Governor praised ITDA for preserving tribal traditions through this initiative.

Topic: Defense

Project Varsha – India's First Nuclear Submarine Base Initiative

• Near **Rambilli**, ~50 km south of **Visakhapatnam**, Andhra Pradesh.

What is Project Varsha?

- A classified naval infrastructure project by the Indian Navy.
- Aimed at building INS Varsha, India's first dedicated nuclear submarine base.
- Scheduled for commissioning in 2026.

Purpose & Strategic Aim:

- Boost India's maritime strike and deterrence capabilities in the Bay of Bengal and Indian
 Ocean Region (IOR).
- Serve as a **counter to China's expanding presence** via bases like Hambantota (Sri Lanka) and BNS Sheikh Hasina (Bangladesh).

Key Features of INS Varsha:

- Underground submarine pens and tunnels for stealth and protection.
- Capacity: Can dock up to 12 nuclear-powered submarines.
- Concealment: Offers protection from aerial and satellite surveillance.
- Proximity to BARC Atchutapuram: Enables access to cutting-edge nuclear technology and infrastructure.
- **Strategic positioning:** Allows quick deployment to critical maritime chokepoints like the **Strait of Malacca**.

INS Aridhaman – India's Third SSBN

- A **7,000-tonne SSBN** (nuclear-powered ballistic missile submarine).
- Part of the Advanced Technology Vessel (ATV) project.
- Built by: Shipbuilding Centre, Visakhapatnam
- With support from BARC and DRDO.

Key Capabilities:

- Equipped to carry more K-4 SLBMs (Submarine-Launched Ballistic Missiles) with a range of 3,500 km.
- More advanced than INS Arihant and INS Arighat (India's earlier SSBNs).
- Designed for long-duration underwater deterrence patrols.
- Expected to be **commissioned in 2025**.

Strategic Role:

- Strengthens India's nuclear triad by enhancing its second-strike capability.
- Operates undetected in deep seas, ensuring credible nuclear deterrence.

Topic: Environment and Ecology

Brazil Proposes Global Climate Council Ahead of COP30

- Brazil has proposed the creation of a Global Climate Council ahead of COP30.
- The proposed Council would serve as an international body to accelerate global climate action.
- **COP30** is scheduled to be held in **Belem**, northern Brazil, in **November 2025**.
- The Council would function under the **United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)**.
- Its key objective is to fast-track decisions made during COP meetings.
- It aims to better coordinate global climate efforts and make actions more effective and timely.

Topic: Awards and Honours

Lisbon Confers 'City Key of Honour' on President Droupadi Murmu

- President Droupadi Murmu received the prestigious 'City Key of Honour' from the Mayor of Lisbon.
- The award ceremony took place at **Lisbon's historic City Hall**.
- The "Key to the City" is the highest civilian honour given by the City of Lisbon.
- This marks the first state visit by an Indian President to Portugal in 27 years—the last being President K.R. Narayanan in 1998.
- President Murmu is on a four-day state visit to Portugal and Slovakia from April 7–10, 2025.
- The visit coincides with the 50th anniversary of India-Portugal diplomatic ties.
- To mark this occasion, President Murmu **released a commemorative stamp** highlighting the shared cultural heritage of both countries.
- She also praised **Portugal's role in strengthening India-EU relations**.
- The first India-EU Summit was held in 2000, during Portugal's EU Presidency.

• In May 2021, Portugal also hosted the "India-EU Plus 27" Leadership Summit.

Topic: Government Schemes and Initiatives

Over 1,700 Anganwadi-cum-Crèches Operating Under Palna Scheme

- A total of **1,761 Anganwadi-cum-Crèches** are currently operational across India under the **Palna Scheme**.
- The Palna Scheme is a centrally sponsored scheme aimed at providing high-quality crèche services for children aged 6 months to 6 years.
- These services ensure a safe and nurturing environment for early childhood care.



Funding Structure of Palna Scheme

- Funding is shared between Centre and States:
 - 60:40 for most states.
 - 90:10 for Northeast and special category states.
- The scheme supports two types of crèches:
 - Standalone crèches 1,284 currently operational.
 - Anganwadi-cum-crèches 1,761 operational.

Crèche Mandate for Employers & Expansion Plan

- As per the **amended Maternity Benefit Act** by the Ministry of Labour & Employment:
 - Establishments with 50+ employees must provide crèche facilities.
- The Palna Scheme ensures access to crèche facilities for all mothers, regardless of employment status.

Future Plans and Approvals

- The Ministry of Women and Child Development plans to establish 17,000 new Anganwadi-cum-Crèches in 2024-25.
- So far, 11,395 Anganwadi-cum-Crèches have been approved across 34 states and UTs.

Background

- In 2022, the National Crèche Scheme was reorganized and renamed as the Palna Scheme.
- It now functions as a sub-scheme 'Samarthya' under Mission Shakti.

Topic: Polity

Kerala Set to Establish Waqf Board Under New Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025

• Kerala is set to establish a new Waqf Board under the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025.

- The previous board's tenure ended on December 19 and is currently on an extended deadline.
- The Kerala High Court has directed the board to function until the new one is elected.
- The state government plans to complete the new board's selection within a month.
- Despite strong opposition earlier, the Act came into effect nationally on April 5, 2025.

Topic: Sports

Rudrankksh Balasaheb Patil Clinches Gold at ISSF World Cup 2025 in Buenos Aires

- Rudrankksh Balasaheb Patil won the gold medal in men's 10m air rifle at the ISSF World Cup 2025 in Buenos Aires.
- This marks his second individual gold at an ISSF World Cup, following his 2023 win in Cairo.
- India jointly tops the medal tally with China, both having won two gold, one silver, and one bronze so far.
- The USA follows in third place with two gold medals.
- India's Arjun Babuta reached the final but missed the podium, while Kiran Ankush Jadhav finished sixth.
- Patil's win brings India's total to four medals at the first ISSF World Cup of the 2025 season.

International Highlights

US Supreme Court Clears Way for Tahawwur Rana's Extradition to India

- The **US Supreme Court** has **rejected the plea** of 26/11 accused **Tahawwur Rana** to block his extradition to India.
- Rana is wanted in India for his role in the **2008 Mumbai terrorist attacks**, which claimed over 174 lives.
 - His plea was marked for "Conference of 4/4/2025" but was ultimately denied by the court.
 - Rana had filed an emergency stay application through Justice Elena Kagan on February 27.
 - He claimed potential torture in India due to his Pakistani Muslim background.
- President Donald Trump had earlier approved his extradition after a meeting with Prime Minister Modi.
- Rana is a **Canadian citizen of Pakistani origin** and was convicted in the US for aiding **Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT)**.
- He allegedly helped **David Coleman Headley** (Daood Gilani) by supplying **false documents** to scout targets.
 - Headley was arrested in 2009 and testified against Rana's involvement.
- The extradition is under the **India-US Extradition Treaty**, signed in **1997**, to hand over wanted criminals.

Trump confirmed that the U.S. and Iran begin direct nuclear talks.

- US President Donald Trump confirmed that direct negotiations between Washington and Tehran on Iran's nuclear program have officially begun.
- Trump told reporters the direct talks would begin on April 12.
- He stressed that Tehran must not be allowed to develop nuclear weapons.
- Trump also warned that Iran would be in "great danger" if diplomatic efforts to curb its nuclear ambitions failed.
- During his previous presidency (2017-2021), Trump withdrew the US from the landmark nuclear deal with Iran, which was negotiated during President Barack Obama's administration.
- The Trump administration had also imposed strict sanctions on Iran, which increased tensions between the two countries.
- The US and Iran have had no direct diplomatic relations since 1980.
- Relations were severed after Iranian revolutionaries stormed the US embassy in Tehran and held 53 diplomat's hostage for 444 days.
