# Tamil Nadu CM Declares April 29 – May 5 as 'Tamil Week' to Honour Poet Bharathidasan

- Honarable Chief Minister MK Stalin announced that April 29 to May 5 will be observed as 'Tamil Week' across Tamil Nadu.
- The announcement was made under Rule 110 in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly.

#### Tribute to Pavendhar Bharathidasan:

- The week commemorates the birth anniversary of Pavendhar Bharathidasan, a revolutionary Tamil poet and social reformer.
- Bharathidasan as a **"poetic force"** who used literature as a tool for **social** transformation.

#### Bharathidasan's Legacy:

- His poetry promoted self-respect, equality, rationalism, women's liberation, and linguistic pride.
- He laid the ideological foundations of the **Dravidian movement** in 1929.
- Revered by leaders like Periyar, Anna, and Kalaignar, Bharathidasan is often described as "Tamil Nadu's Walt Whitman."

#### • Statewide Celebrations:

- Poetry Recitals & Literary Seminars: Events in all districts highlighting his works.
- Bharathidasan Young Creator Award: A new state-level award for emerging Tamil literary talent.
- **Literary Research Forums**: Discussions on classic Tamil literature and its relevance today.
- School-Level Competitions: Essay writing, poetry, and speech contests to engage students.
- o **Cultural Programs**: Showcasing traditional Tamil music, dance, and folk arts.
- Quoting Bharathidasan, CM Stalin said: "Let Tamil flourish like the ocean."

## **Tamil Nadu Government Announces Key Healthcare Initiatives**

- ₹1,000 monthly aid will be provided to 7,618 children living with HIV/AIDS for nutrition, education, and medical needs.
- **500** new postgraduate medical seats will be added across 13 government medical colleges and Kalaignar Centenary Super Speciality Hospital.

- Nutritious food (milk, egg white, sundal) will be given to haemodialysis patients at all government medical college hospitals.
- **Dialysis services** will be launched at **50 upgraded Primary Health Centres** in rural areas via public-private partnerships.
- **642 new health sub-centres** will be established based on population needs in urban and rural areas.
- Special nutrition kits (Vitamin D3, iron, multivitamins) will be provided for 50,000 low birth weight babies post-discharge from SNCUs.
- Other initiatives include hand-held X-ray devices, AI-based TB detection, clinical epidemiology departments, and colour-coded linen systems.

## **India's Electricity Generation Hits Record High in FY25**

#### **Total Generation:**

• 1,821 Billion Units (BU) – A 5% year-on-year increase, the highest ever recorded.

- Thermal power had the **weakest growth** among all major sources.
- Renewables and hydro played a key role in meeting additional electricity demand.

#### **Electricity Demand Trends:**

Peak demand rose modestly:

o FY24: 240 GW


o FY25: 250 GW

• Demand **stabilized** after previous sharp increases.

India's power sector is witnessing a **strong transition towards cleaner energy**, with **renewables**, **hydro**, **and nuclear** driving growth, while coal-based generation continues to slow down.

## J&K: Security Intensified Across Kashmir Valley After Pahalgam Terror Attack

- Heightened security measures have been enforced across the Kashmir Valley following a terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Anantnag district, that resulted in the killing of several tourists.
- A joint combing operation by the Army, CRPF, and J&K Police is underway, extending over a 5 km radius from the attack site using special forces, sniffer dogs, and technical intelligence tools.



- Checkpoints have been set up on highways and sensitive zones, and quick reaction teams
  have been stationed at key locations and tourist spots.
- Frisking and surveillance operations have intensified in Srinagar, Gulmarg, and Sonamarg, especially around hotels accommodating tourists.
- Lt Gen MV Suchendra Kumar, Northern Army Commander, will be briefed by local commanders in Srinagar on the current security status.
- The targeted attack on tourists during peak spring travel season has triggered major security concerns across the Union Territory.
- Rescue and identification efforts are ongoing, with top security officials working to determine the final casualty figures.

## **Topic: Defence**

## **Army Launches 'Voice of Kinnaur' Radio Station in Himachal Pradesh**

- The Indian Army launched a community radio station, 'Voice of Kinnaur', in Kinnaur district, Himachal Pradesh, under Operation Sadbhavana.
- Aim: Disseminate local news, education, health updates, and promote regional culture.
- Special focus: Empowering **youth**, **women**, and **apple farmers** by giving them a platform to voice their concerns and achievements.
- Launch venue: **Army Tripeak Public School**, attended by senior officials from the **Surya Command**.

#### **About Operation Sadbhavana:**

- Operation Sadbhavana is a humanitarian initiative by the Indian Army in Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh to support communities affected by terrorism.
- Key efforts include Army Goodwill Schools, infrastructure projects, and

educational tours for children in remote areas of Ladakh.

 The operation promotes national integration, women empowerment, employment, and development, with projects aligned to local aspirations and civil administration plans.

## Indian Navy Completes Major Refit of Maldivian Coast Guard Ship MNDF Huravee

- The Indian Navy successfully completed the major refit of the Maldivian Coast Guard Ship MNDF Huravee.
- This refit aligns with India's regional maritime security strategy under the **MAHASAGAR** vision.

#### • MAHASAGAR Vision:

- MAHASAGAR stands for 'Mutual and Holistic Advancement for Security and Growth for All in the Region'.
- It builds on the earlier **SAGAR** (Security and Growth for All in the Region) initiative introduced by PM Modi in 2015. ☐ ⑥

#### • Neighbourhood First Policy:

- The refit highlights India's 'Neighbourhood First' policy, which was launched in 2008.
- The policy is guided by the principles of Samman (respect), Samvad (dialogue), Shanti (peace), and Samriddhi (prosperity).
- Countries included in the Neighbourhood First policy: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka.

#### Make in India Ship:

- MNDF Huravee was built under the Make in India initiative and delivered to the Maldives National Defence Force in May 2023.
- It replaced an older platform within the Maldives Coast Guard fleet.

#### • Role of MNDF Huravee:

- The ship plays a crucial role in Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) operations.
- It also contributes to Medical Evacuation operations across the Maldivian islands.

#### Strengthening Diplomatic and Military Cooperation:

- The refit showcases the **strong diplomatic and military cooperation** between India and the Maldives.
- It reflects India's commitment to regional security and collaboration.


- Strategic Importance of Maldives:

## India Shines at ISSF World Cup 2025 in Shooting Events

**Location:** Buenos Aires & Lima

- Rudrankksh Patil & Arya Borse: Silver in 10m Air Rifle Mixed
   Team (Final score: 9-17 against China).
- Arjun Babuta: Silver in Men's 10m Air Rifle, missing gold by just 0.1 points to Lihao Sheng (China).

## 12% Safeguard Duty on Steel Imports

- Centre imposed a 12% safeguard duty on certain alloy and non-alloy steel flat products on 21 April 2025.
- Duty is applicable for 200 days to curb low-cost imports and protect domestic steelmakers.
- It covers **five categories**: hot/cold-rolled coils, sheets, plates, metallic- and color-coated products.
- Import prices are fixed between \$675 to \$964 per tonne (CIF basis).
- Imports below this price range will attract the 12% safeguard duty.
- Imports at or above the threshold prices are exempt from this duty.
- The move supports **domestic producers**, especially **SMEs** under pressure from surging imports.
- Aims to ensure fair pricing and stabilize the Indian steel market.

## **India's Infrastructure Output Growth in March 2025**

- India's infrastructure output increased by 3.8% in March 2025.
- Positive growth was recorded in cement, fertilisers, steel, electricity, coal, and refinery products.



- The Index of Eight Core Industries (ICI) showed a 4.4% growth for FY25 compared to the previous year.
- Cement production led the growth at 11.6%, followed by fertilisers (8.8%) and steel (7.1%).
- Electricity production increased by 6.2%, while coal production grew by 1.6%.
- Petroleum refinery products showed minimal growth of 0.2%.
- However, natural gas production declined by 12.7%, and crude oil dropped by 1.9%.
- The ICI measures the performance of coal, crude oil, natural gas, refinery products, fertilisers, steel, cement, and electricity.
- These sectors account for 40.27% of the weight in the Index of Industrial Production, with the base year set at 2011-12.

## **Topic: Science and Technology**

## ISRO Achieves Second Successful Satellite Docking under SpaDeX Mission

- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) successfully performed its second satellite docking under the SpaDeX Mission.
- Satellites Involved:
  - SDX-01 (chaser) and SDX-02 (target), each weighing approx.
     220 kg.
  - Launched on December 30, 2024, via PSLV-C60 from Sriharikota.



- Timeline of Events:
  - First Docking: January 16, 2025
  - Undocking: March 13, 2025
  - Second Docking: April 20, 2025

#### **Significance & Technological Innovation**

- India becomes the fourth nation (after USA, Russia, and China) to achieve in-space satellite
  docking.
- The **indigenous Bharatiya Docking System** developed by ISRO includes:
  - Docking mechanism
  - Four docking sensors
  - Power transfer capability
  - Inter-Satellite Link (ISL)
  - Autonomous docking strategy with intelligent response capability
- This breakthrough is crucial for:

- Chandrayaan-4 and future lunar missions
- On-orbit servicing
- Space station modules
- Deep space operations without reliance on Earth-based systems like GNSS

## **Topic: Important Days**

## World Earth Day 2025 - April 22

- Celebrated every year on 22nd April.
- Known as World Earth Day or International Mother Earth Day.

#### Purpose:

- To raise awareness about environmental degradation.
- Encourage action to protect the environment from pollution, climate change, deforestation, and other threats.

#### Theme for 2025:

 "Our Power, Our Planet" — emphasizes collective responsibility and empowerment to restore and protect the Earth.

## Historical Background:

- Originated in the 1970s.
- Founded by Senator Gaylord Nelson (USA) in response to increasing pollution and environmental issues.
- o Inspired by the **Santa Barbara oil spill** (1969), one of the worst environmental disasters at the time.
- First Earth Day was observed on April 22, 1970.

#### Significance:

- Highlights critical issues like climate change, biodiversity loss, air and water pollution, and unsustainable consumption.
- Encourages individuals, communities, governments, and organizations to take sustainable actions.

## **International Highlights**

#### India-Saudi Arabia Relations & PM Modi's Visit

- PM Modi visited Saudi Arabia from **April 22–23, 2025**, marking his **third official visit** after 2016 and 2019.
- The visit emphasized discussions on **regional security**, **humanitarian coordination**, and **strategic partnership**.

- Six MoUs were signed in sectors like space, energy, health, science, culture, and advanced technology.
- Modi lauded Saudi Arabia's wins to host World Expo 2030 and FIFA World Cup 2034.
- The Strategic Partnership Council, formed in 2019, has deepened bilateral cooperation.
- Diplomatic ties date back to **1947**; the **'Riyadh Declaration' (2010)** elevated ties to a strategic level.
- Saudi Arabia is India's **5th-largest trading partner**; total trade reached **\$42.98 billion** in FY 2023–24.
- The partnership is vital for India's energy security, expatriate welfare, and regional stability.
