TamilNadu Highlights

Supreme Court on Tamil Nadu Governor's Actions

- **Issue:** Governor **R. N. Ravi** had **reserved 10 re-adopted bills** (previously passed again by the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly) for **Presidential assent**, prompting a legal challenge by the **Government of Tamil Nadu**.

Supreme Court Ruling:

- The Governor's action was declared **"illegal and erroneous."**
- **Key Judgements:**
 - **No Discretionary Power:**

The **Governor cannot use discretion** to reserve **re-presented bills** (bills passed again by the State Assembly) **for the President**, unless there is a **substantive difference** from the original bill.
 - **Article 163 – Aid and Advice:**

The Governor is **bound to act** on the **aid and advice of the Council of Ministers**, led by the Chief Minister.
 - **Article 200 – Assent to Bills:**

The Governor does **not have discretionary power** under Article 200 to **withhold assent** arbitrarily. The article requires the Governor to act as per the **Council of Ministers' advice**.

Governor's Constitutional Role:

- **Appointed by:** President of India
- **Position:** Constitutional Head of the State
- **Tenure:** Holds office during the **pleasure of the President**
- **Powers:** All **executive powers** of the State are vested in the Governor.

List of **10 Bills approved by the Supreme Court** regarding Tamil Nadu universities:

1. **Tamil Nadu Universities Laws (Amendment) Bill**
 - Grants the Chief Minister the power to appoint Vice-Chancellors.
2. **University of Madras (Amendment) Bill**
 - Changes in the authority for appointing the Vice-Chancellor.
3. **Periyar University (Amendment) Bill**
 - Administrative restructuring and transfer of powers.
4. **Anna University (Amendment) Bill**
 - Chief Minister to appoint the Vice-Chancellor.
5. **Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University (Amendment) Bill**
 - Changes in administrative setup of the university.

6. **Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University (Amendment) Bill**
– Modifications in Vice-Chancellor appointment powers.
7. **Tamil Nadu Open University (Amendment) Bill**
– Changes in administrative authority.
8. **Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University (Amendment) Bill**
– Empowers the Chief Minister to appoint the Vice-Chancellor.
9. **Tamil Nadu Technological University (Amendment) Bill**
– Transfer of administrative powers.
10. **Tamil Nadu Agricultural University (Amendment) Bill**
– Empowers the Chief Minister to appoint the Vice-Chancellor.

These Bills were **re-adopted by the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly** after the Governor withheld assent and reserved them for the President. The Supreme Court ruled that the Governor's actions were **illegal**, affirming that **he must act on the advice of the Council of Ministers** and **cannot withhold or reserve such Bills without valid justification**.

First Himalayan High-Altitude Atmospheric & Climate Centre Inaugurated in Udhampur, J&K

- **Inauguration:** Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh inaugurated the **first-ever Himalayan High-Altitude Atmospheric & Climate Centre** on **8 April 2025** at **Nathatop, Chenani** in **Udhampur district, Jammu & Kashmir**.
- **Altitude & Location:** Situated at **2,250 metres above sea level**, the location was strategically selected for its **clean air and low pollution**, ideal for studying **free tropospheric atmospheric conditions**.
- **Purpose:**
 - To provide **accurate weather and climate forecasts** for the region.
 - To support **high-altitude atmospheric and climate research** in the Himalayas.

Bangladesh Joins Artemis Accords

- **Event:** Bangladesh became the **54th country** to sign the **Artemis Accords** with **NASA** (U.S. Space Agency).
- **Benefits for Bangladesh:**
 - **Technology transfer**
 - **Economic cooperation**
 - **Scientific collaboration**
 - Enhanced capabilities for **Bangladesh Space Research and Remote Sensing Organisation (SPARRSO)** through cooperation with NASA.



About the Artemis Accords:

- **Established:** October 2020 by **NASA**
- **Nature:** Set of **non-binding agreements**
- **Aim:**
 - Promote **peaceful, transparent, and cooperative** civil space exploration.
 - Ensure sustainable and responsible use of **outer space**.
 - Provide a **common framework** for governance of civil space activities.

Key Facts:

- **Total Signatories (as of April 2025):** 54 countries
 - Includes **USA, UK, India (joined in 2023), Japan, Canada, South Korea, UAE, Australia,** and several **European & Latin American nations.**
- **Bangladesh's Space Agency: SPARRSO**
 - Will benefit from collaboration with **NASA** under the accords.

Artemis Program Milestones:

- **First Mission:** Launch of **Orion spacecraft** aboard the **Space Launch System (SLS)** in **2022.**

7th Edition of Poshan Pakhwada 2025:

- **Launched on April 8, 2025** by Union Minister **Savitri Thakur** in **New Delhi.**
- The campaign will run till **April 22, 2025.**
- Aims to combat **malnutrition** and improve **nutrition outcomes.**
- Targets **children, pregnant women, lactating mothers,** and **adolescent girls.**
- Focuses on **healthy lifestyles, malnutrition management,** and **Poshan Tracker awareness.**
- **Ministry of Women and Child Development** is the nodal agency.
- Supported by ministries of **Health, Education, Rural Development, Jal Shakti,** and **State/UT governments.**

₹22,919 Crore Electronics Component Scheme Notified to Boost Atmanirbhar Bharat

- The Government of India has notified the ₹22,919 crore Electronics Component Manufacturing Scheme.
- It aims to strengthen the domestic electronics supply chain and promote self-reliance (Atmanirbhar Bharat).
- The scheme focuses on attracting global and domestic investments in component manufacturing.
- It targets an investment of ₹59,350 crore and production worth ₹4,56,500 crore.
- The initiative is expected to generate 91,600 direct jobs and many more indirect ones.
- It will boost domestic value addition and integrate Indian firms into global value chains. A portal will be launched soon to invite applications from interested companies.
- Consultations with industry stakeholders will help shape the implementation guidelines.
- In the past decade, electronics manufacturing in India has grown fivefold.
- Mobile phone exports crossed ₹2 lakh crore in FY 2024-25, creating 25 lakh jobs overall.

Topic: Economy

RBI's latest monetary policy announcement (April 2025):

- **RBI cuts the repo rate** by 0.25% to **6%**, marking the **second consecutive cut** to support economic growth amidst global trade tensions.
- **GDP growth forecast** for FY 2025-26 is revised down from **6.7% to 6.5%**, with quarterly estimates ranging from 6.3% to 6.7%.
- **Policy stance shifted** from neutral to **accommodative**, indicating the RBI may **implement further rate cuts** if needed.
- **Loans (home, auto, etc.) are expected to get cheaper**, benefiting borrowers, but **interest income for depositors may fall**.
- The decision comes amid the **global trade war**, triggered by U.S. tariffs, impacting **exports, investment, and business confidence**.
- **Inflation is projected** at **4%** for FY 2025-26; while upside risks like currency pressure exist, slowing global growth may **soften inflation**.
- RBI Governor **Sanjay Malhotra** emphasized a focus on **non-inflationary growth**, staying agile and decisive amid **global economic uncertainties**.

- **Theme 2025**: This year's theme, 'Adhyayan, Adhyaapan, Anusandhaan' (Education, Practice, and Research),

International Highlights

India-Israel Sign Agreements to Boost Bilateral Agricultural Cooperation

- Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan and Israeli Agriculture Minister Avi Dichter signed key agreements in New Delhi.



- The aim is to modernize agriculture and strengthen food security through bilateral cooperation.
- Focus areas include soil and water management, horticulture, mechanization, and R&D. The agreement also covers post-harvest tech, animal husbandry, and processing systems.
- Both countries committed to increasing agricultural productivity and sustainability. Chouhan praised the 43 Centers of Excellence across India for supporting joint initiatives.
- A Joint Working Group will be formed to ensure consistent progress and clear timelines.
- India and Israel have shared close ties since formalizing diplomatic relations in 1992.
- Their cooperation spans agriculture, defence, water management, and innovation.
- This pact reinforces the growing strategic partnership and shared vision for food security.
