Tamil Nadu Government Announces ₹24 Crore for Climate Literacy and Environmental Initiatives

- ₹24 Crore for Climate Literacy: ₹24 crore allocated to expand eco-clubs in schools, organize nature camps, and conduct state-level competitions to promote climate literacy in Tamil Nadu.
- **Bio-Shield Programme Expansion**: ₹8.45 crore to expand the bio-shield programme for protecting and rehabilitating coastal habitats, with 195 hectares of mangroves planted and 395 hectares of degraded mangrove forests restored.
- **Coastal Resilience**: The bio-shield programme will be extended to Cuddalore and Thoothukudi, integrating native tree species, mangroves, and salt-tolerant crops for enhanced coastal resilience, carbon sequestration, and supporting local livelihoods.
- Sanjeevi Malai Restoration: A project to restore degraded landscapes, enhance biodiversity, and contribute to carbon neutrality through the restoration and afforestation of Sanjeevi Malai in Rajapalayam.
- Waterbody and Mine Restoration: ₹16 crore to restore six waterbodies and 20 odais, addressing urbanization, pollution, and invasive species. Ecological restoration of abandoned mines in Madukkarai to create biodiversity-friendly landscapes.

Tamil Nadu's Bill to Prevent Coercive Actions by Money Lenders

- Bill Introduction: Deputy Chief Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin introduced the Tamil Nadu Money Lending Entities (Prevention of Coercive Actions) Bill, 2025 on April 26, 2025.
- Focus on Vulnerable Groups: The Bill aims to protect economically weaker and vulnerable sections of society, including farmers, women, self-help groups, agricultural laborers, and migrant workers from coercive recovery actions by money lending entities.
- Rise in Unmanageable Debt: Vulnerable groups are often targeted by money lending entities, including digital lending platforms, leading them into unsustainable debt.

- Coercive Recovery Practices: Many lending entities use unethical recovery methods, which
 put immense financial and emotional pressure on borrowers, sometimes resulting in suicide
 and family distress.
- Statutory Framework: The Bill seeks to establish a legal framework to prevent the misuse of debt recovery practices, ensuring that vulnerable people are protected from further financial hardships.
- **Social and Psychological Impact**: Udhayanidhi emphasized that coercive recovery methods disturb **social order** and cause irreparable damage to the mental well-being of borrowers.
- **Objective**: The Bill's primary aim is to provide a **protective mechanism** for individuals and groups facing financial distress due to coercive and unethical recovery methods by money lending entities.

National Highlights

Topic: Ranking and indices

IISc Leads India in Asia Rankings 2025

- Top Indian University: The Indian Institute of Science (IISc) ranked highest among Indian universities, securing the 38th position in the Times Higher Education (THE) Asia University Rankings 2025 with a score of 65.2.
- Seven Indian Universities in the List: 7 Indian universities were featured in the Asia University Rankings 2025, showcasing India's growing academic strength.
- Anna University ranked second among Indian universities, securing the 111th position with a score of 52.3.
- Other Notable Rankings:
 - **IIT Indore** was placed at **131st**.
 - Mahatma Gandhi University ranked 140th.
 - Shoolini University of Biotechnology and Management Sciences was 146th.
 - Saveetha Institute of Medical and Technical Sciences secured 149th.
- Jamia Millia Islamia: The seventh Indian university, Jamia Millia Islamia, ranked at 161st in the Asia rankings.
- China's Dominance: China continued to dominate the rankings with Tsinghua University and Peking University taking the top two positions.
- Top 10 Institutions: The National University of Singapore secured the 3rd position, and universities from Japan and Hong Kong also featured in the top 10.

Topic: Science and Technology

DRDO's Success in Scramjet Engine Development

- Milestone Achievement: The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO)
 achieved a major success in scramjet engine
 development through a 1,000-second ground test of
 the Actively Cooled Scramjet Subscale Combustor.
- Test Location: The test was conducted on 25 April 2025 at the Scramjet Connect Test Facility at the Defence Research and Development Laboratory (DRDL) in Hyderabad.



- Previous Tests: This successful test follows an earlier 120-second test conducted in January
 2025, marking a progression in the development.
- Hypersonic Technology: The test is a significant step in the development of hypersonic technology, which is essential for hypersonic cruise missiles that travel at speeds over five times the speed of sound.
- Supersonic Combustion: Supersonic combustion plays a crucial role in enabling sustained flight conditions for hypersonic cruise missiles.
- Next Steps: With this success, the scramjet combustor system is now prepared for full-scale, flight-worthy combustor testing.

Topic: Personality in News

Dr. Krishnaswamy Kasturirangan, former ISRO Chairman, passed away in Bengaluru.

- His mortal remains will be kept at the Raman Research Institute.
 He was instrumental in shaping India's National Education Policy (NEP).
- He served as **Chancellor of Jawaharlal Nehru University** and Chairman of the **Karnataka Knowledge Commission**.
- As ISRO Chairman (1992-2003), he played a key role in developing the **ASLV** and **PSLV** launch vehicles and mentoring many scientists, including current ISRO chief **S. Somanath**.

Topic: Important Days

International Design Day 2025 (World Design Day 2025)

- Celebrated on **April 27, 2025**, International Design Day (previously World Graphics Day) acknowledges the significance of design in everyday life.
- **History**: The day was first introduced in **1995** by Kim Paulsen, V.P. of the International Council of Graphic Design Associations (ico-D), under the name **World Graphics Day**.
- Core Objectives of Design: Brilliant design is memorable, inspirational, and educational, creating a lasting impact on people's lives.

- Purpose: The day celebrates all aspects of design, including aesthetics, form, and function, and promotes the fields of visual communication, graphic design, management, and training.
- 2025 Theme: The theme for International Design Day 2025 is "Outlandish Optimism", highlighting the role of design in fostering positive change and innovation.

International Highlights

UNESCO Adds 16 New Sites to Global Geoparks Network

- The Global Geoparks Network (GGN), is a non-profit International Association officially established in 2014 subject to French legislation. The Global Geoparks Network is the official partner of UNESCO for the operation of the UNESCO Global Geoparks.
- UNESCO added 16 new sites to its Global Geoparks Network across 11 countries.
- Countries Involved: The new sites are located in China, North Korea, Ecuador, Indonesia, Italy, Norway, South Korea, Saudi Arabia, Spain, the UK, and Vietnam.
- North Korea's Debut: For the first time, North Korea was included in the UNESCO Global Geoparks Network.
- Saudi Arabia's Debut: Saudi Arabia made its debut, with two newly designated geoparks.
- Total Sites: The Global Geoparks Network now includes 229 sites in 50 countries.
- These sites cover an area of nearly **855,000 square kilometers**, approximately the size of **Namibia**.
- India's Status: As of July 26, 2024, India does not have any sites listed on the UNESCO Global Geoparks list.
- 10th Anniversary: The Global Geoparks Network celebrated its 10th anniversary in 2024, having been introduced by UNESCO in 2015 to recognize areas with internationally significant geological heritage.

India's Medical Aid to Nepal Under the Neighborhood First Policy

- India sent USD 2 million worth of medical aid to Nepal under its Neighborhood First Policy.
- The aid includes **medicines and vaccines** specifically for patients suffering from **thalassemia** and **sickle cell disease**.
- First Tranche: The first batch of aid comprises 17,030 vials of vaccines for the immunization of thalassemia patients.
- Response to Nepal's Request: This medical assistance was sent in response to a specific request from Nepal for support in managing these health conditions.



- **Neighborhood First Policy**: India's **Neighborhood First Policy** aims to strengthen relations with neighboring countries, focusing on **mutual benefits** and **people-centric cooperation**.
- Regional Cooperation: The policy emphasizes physical, digital, and people-to-people connectivity, aiming for regional stability and prosperity.
- Ongoing Support: India continues to provide developmental assistance, infrastructure support, and capacity-building initiatives to its neighboring countries, in line with the principles of respect, dialogue, peace, and prosperity.

Tenth Memorial Day of the 2015 Gorkha Earthquake in Nepal

- Nepal observed the **tenth Memorial Day** of the **2015 Gorkha Earthquake** on April 25, 2025.
- Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli inaugurated a memorial program at Dharahara in Kathmandu.
- The day focused on **earthquake safety** awareness and promoting **earthquake-resistant infrastructure**.
- A photo exhibition on the earthquake was inaugurated in **Gorkha** by photojournalist **Prakash Timilsina**.
- A **4.1 magnitude tremor** was recorded in **Sindhupalchowk** on the same day.
