TamilNadu Highlights

Nationalisation of Works by Tamil Scholars

Event: Valedictory of 'Tamil Week' marking the birth anniversary of Tamil poet Pavendhar Bharathidasan.

Key Announcement:

- Honorable CM **M.K. Stalin** to announce the **nationalisation of literary works** by five Tamil scholars.
- Royalties from these works to be handed over to the **families** of the scholars.

Purpose: To bring the intellectual contributions of Tamil scholars to the masses and preserve their heritage.

Other Activities:

- CM Stalin will present prizes to winners of literary competitions held during Tamil Week.
- Various literary events organized across Tamil Nadu since April 29, 2025.

National Highlights

Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB) and water release proposal

- The **Central Government** has proposed releasing **4,500** cusecs of additional water from BBMB dams.
- Purpose: To ease water shortages in Haryana and parts of Rajasthan.
- Duration: Water to be released over 8 days.



- Held in **New Delhi**, chaired by the **Union Home Secretary**.
- Attended by senior central officials and representatives from Punjab, Haryana, and Rajasthan.
- All three are **partner states** in the BBMB.

Key Outcomes:

- **Punjab** will be given **additional water if needed** during the dam-filling season.
- The **BBMB will hold a follow-up meeting** to finalize the process of supplying extra water to Haryana.

About **BBMB**:

• Established in **1976**.



- Manages water and power from:
 - Bhakra-Nangal Project
 - Beas Project Unit-I (Beas-Sutlej Link)
 - Beas Project Unit-II (Pong Dam)
- Supplies water and power to:
 - Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Delhi, and Chandigarh
- Functions:
 - **Regulation of water** from Satluj, Ravi, and Beas rivers.
 - Operation and maintenance of major dam projects.
 - Supply of hydroelectric power.
 - Provides technical and consultancy services.

Domestic Violence, Assault Top Reported Crimes Against Women in 2025

Source: National Commission for Women (NCW)

Total Complaints in 2025 (so far): 7,698

- Domestic Violence: 1,594 complaints

 Jan: 367 | Feb: 390 | Mar: 513 | Apr: 322 | May: 2
 → Nearly 20% of total complaints
- Other Major Categories: Significant complaints included criminal intimidation (989), assault (950), dowry harassment (916), rape/attempt to rape (394), molestation (310), sexual harassment (302), and cybercrimes (110).
- **Monthly Trends**: April 2025 saw the **highest spike** in complaints with **2,123 cases**, especially in domestic violence, while March also reported high numbers.
- Uncategorized Complaints: Around 881 complaints were still marked as "Not Categorized yet" as of early May.
- State-Wise Breakdown: Uttar Pradesh recorded the highest number (3,921) over 50% of the national total followed by Delhi (688) and Maharashtra (473).
- Other High-Reporting States: Madhya Pradesh (351), Bihar (342), and Haryana (306) also reported significant complaint numbers.
- Reason Behind High Numbers: Officials attribute the rising figures to increased awareness among women regarding their rights and improved access to grievance platforms like the NCW portal.

World Press Freedom Index 2025: India's Performance and Global Context

Published by: Reporters Without Borders (RSF)

Purpose: Assesses the level of press freedom in 180 countries, based on journalists' ability to work freely and independently.

- India's Rank (2025): 151 out of 180 countries
 - 2024 Rank: 159
 - 2023 Rank: 161
 - Category: Very Serious (indicating high concern for press freedom)
 - Despite the improvement, India remains in the lowest global category.



- Global Context:
 - Top Performers:
 - Norway (1st)
 - Estonia (2nd)
 - Netherlands (3rd)
 - For the first time, **global press freedom** is classified as in a **"difficult situation"**, driven by:
 - Economic pressures
 - Political interference
 - Deteriorating safety for journalists
- **RSF Evaluation Criteria**: The index evaluates countries based on:
 - Political context
 - Economic context
 - Legislative framework
 - Social environment
 - Security situation

Next-Generation Air Defence System

• The Indian government has initiated the procurement of a **next-generation air defence system** through a tender released by the Ministry of Defence.

- The system is designed to **identify and neutralize low-range aerial targets**, including drones, helicopters, and fighter jets.
- It will operate effectively in **temperatures below -30°C and above 50°C**, ensuring all-weather performance.
- The system will function **round-the-clock**, enabled by **advanced infrared technology**, allowing effective surveillance and targeting even in low visibility.
- It will be deployable in **mountainous terrain**, **deserts**, **and coastal zones**, covering all strategic areas of concern.
- The system will support **human-operated long-duration missions**, providing flexibility and tactical advantage.
- The initial phase includes **48 missile launchers**, **85 missiles**, and **48 technical equipment units**, as well as a possible **missile testing centre**.

Topic: Environment

Jaigir Village Relocated from Core Area of Palamu Tiger Reserve

- Jaigir Village Relocation: After years of efforts by forest officials, Jaigir has become the first village to be completely relocated outside the core area of Palamu Tiger Reserve (PTR).
- Location of PTR: Palamu Tiger Reserve is located in the western part of the Chotanagpur Plateau and spans across the Latehar and Garhwa districts in Jharkhand.



- Reserve Area: PTR covers a total area of 1,014 square kilometers:
 - **414 square kilometers** designated as the **core area** (protected habitat for tigers).
 - **600 square kilometers** form the **buffer zone** (supporting areas for conservation).
- Project Tiger: PTR was among the first nine tiger reserves established in India under Project Tiger, a flagship conservation program launched in 1973 by the Government of India to protect tigers and their habitats.
- **Relocation Significance**: The relocation of Jaigir village is part of efforts to minimize human-wildlife conflict and ensure the protection and restoration of tiger habitats in the core areas.

Topic: Schemes and Initiatives

MoSJE and UNDP Collaborate on NAMASTE Scheme to Empower Wastepickers

- Collaboration Between MoSJE and UNDP: The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MoSJE) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) have partnered to work on the wastepickers component of the National Action for Mechanised Sanitation Ecosystem (NAMASTE) Scheme.
- UNDP's Role: UNDP is providing financial support to State Project Management Units (PMUs) to help strengthen the implementation of the NAMASTE scheme.
- Launch of NAMASTE Scheme: The NAMASTE Scheme was jointly launched by MoSJE and the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) in 2023 with the primary aim of protecting the safety and dignity of sanitation workers.
- Wastepicker Component: The wastepicker component of the scheme was launched in 2024 with the goal to digitally profile and register 2.5 lakh wastepickers across India.
- Benefits for Wastepickers:
 - Health Insurance: Wastepickers are provided health insurance under the Ayushman Bharat–Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY).
 - **Skill Development**: The scheme also offers **skill development training** to improve the livelihoods of wastepickers.
- **Impact of the Scheme**: This initiative aims to ensure better living and working conditions for wastepickers while integrating them into formal sanitation and waste management systems.

Topic: Sports

PM Inaugurates Seventh Khelo India Youth Games in Bihar

- PM Modi inaugurated the 7th Khelo India Youth Games in Bihar via videoconferencing .
- Location: The games are held in Patna, Nalanda, Gaya, Bhagalpur, and Begusarai from May 4 to May 15.
- Participants: Over 8,500 players and 1,500 technical staff will compete in 28 sports.
- **Government Focus**: PM highlighted **Khelo India** and other programs for promoting sports and fostering India's **growing sporting culture**.
- Infrastructure Investment: The sports budget has increased to ₹4,000 crore, with infrastructure developments like the Khelo India State Centre of Excellence in Rajgir.
- International Recognition: PM emphasized India's rising success in new sports like wushu, lawn bowls, and roller skating.

International Highlights

Powerful Earthquake Strikes Southern Chile and Argentina; Tsunami Alert Issued

- On 2 May 2025, a powerful 7.4 magnitude earthquake struck near the southern coast of Chile and Argentina, as confirmed by the US Geological Survey (USGS).
- The **epicenter** was located **219 km offshore in the Drake Passage**, between South America's southern tip and Antarctica, at a shallow depth of **10 km**.
- The US National Weather Service issued a tsunami warning, with Chile's disaster agency SENAPRED estimating wave heights of 1 to 3 meters.
- Evacuations were ordered in coastal areas of the Magallanes region of Chile, though the evacuation order was later lifted after the threat subsided.
- **Residents were advised** it was safe to return and resume normal activities.
- Chile's tectonic location, at the convergence of the Nazca, South American, and Antarctic plates, makes it highly seismically active.

Anthony Albanese's Labor Party Wins Historic Re-election

- Anthony Albanese became the first Australian Prime Minister in two decades to win consecutive terms.
- His Labor Party secured a clear majority, projected to win 80 out of 150 seats in the House of Representatives.
- The victory was driven by public concerns over **cost-of-living issues** and a strong **national campaign**.
- Influence of former **U.S. President Donald Trump** on global politics also shaped **voter sentiment**.



- Peter Dutton, leader of the opposition Liberal Party, conceded defeat and lost his own seat.
- Albanese emphasized Australia's independent values, pride, and fairness in his victory speech.
- Minor parties and independents remained influential under Australia's ranked-choice voting system.

UNOCT Launches VoTAN for Victims of Terrorism

• Launch of VoTAN: The United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism (UNOCT) has launched VoTAN (Victims of Terrorism Advocacy Network) to support victims and survivors of terrorism globally.

- Initiative Background: VoTAN emerged from the efforts of the Group of Friends of Victims of Terrorism, co-chaired by Spain and Iraq, formed six years ago to protect victims' rights.
- UN Global Congress Outcome: VoTAN is a key outcome of the 2022 United Nations Global Congress on Victims of Terrorism.
- **Purpose**: The network aims to provide a **safe platform** for victims to **connect**, **heal**, **build resilience**, and become **educators**, **peacebuilders**, and **advocates**.
- **Financial Support**: The initiative is financially backed by **Spain** to ensure its successful implementation.
